FACTS:

Autistic individuals have a higher rate of encounters with first responders than the general population. During emergency situations, individuals with autism, developmental & intellectual disabilities, may become over stimulated or express defensive behaviors and need assistance to regulate emotions and communicate.

THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT ENCOUNTERS IS APPROXIMATELY 30 PERCENT HIGHER FOR CHILDREN WITH ASD, 70 PERCENT HIGHER FOR TEENS WITH ASD FROM AGES 15 TO 18, AND TWICE AS HIGH FOR ADULTS WITH ASD. (3)

Autism Quick Facts:

Autism is a neuro-developmental disability that can affect an individual's social skills, communication abilities, and behavior throughout the lifespan.

1 in 31 children are diagnosed with ASD according to the CDC.

*Common Characteristics:

- Delay in or absence of speech
- Elopement
- Difficulty with changes/transitions in routine
- Repetitive movements (stimming)
- Difficulty with socializing and reading social queues
- Hyper or hypo sensitivity to sounds, textures, lighting, etc.

*This is not a complete list of characteristics.
Individuals may display some or all of these characteristics to varying degrees.

Common Co-Occurring Conditions of Autism:

Fragile X syndrome, ADHD, Down syndrome, depression, Duchenne muscular dystrophy, neurofibromatosis type I, intellectual disabilities, epilepsy, macrocephaly, hydrocephalus, cerebral palsy, migraine/headaches, congenital abnormalities of the nervous system, and gastrointestinal disorders
